Reading, chose certain path...

Read it again...

Choose the same path through the book.

I always wondered what was down the other paths, but when I got there, I didn't want to miss out on the adventure that looked the most exciting!

Tonight this is **how I'm going** to preach.

I'm going to chat about something that **you choose**,

Then you get to,

by **vote**,

choose the **next direction**, and away we'll go.

So let's pray...

We're in the **middle of looking** at how Moses lead the Israelites from **captivity to freedom**,

From **oppression to liberty**.

And last week we finished with them walking through the red sea, and we read...

Exodus 14:29 But the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left. **30** That day the LORD saved Israel from the hands of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians lying dead on the shore. **31** And when the Israelites saw the great power the LORD displayed against the Egyptians, the people feared the LORD and put their trust in him and in Moses his servant.

Which brings us to our first choice...

Do you want the sermon to go on?

Or do you want to endure a second offering?

(click on the one I say to click on)

EXCELLENT...

Ok so the Israelites are in the dessert,
 It's barren, there are **over a million people**,
 it's **hot** and **dry**,
 but they are **free**...

And as is **typical to the human** condition,
 when it's not all comfortable,
 we start to.... **whinge?**

And they started to whinge and **God heard their complaining** and
responded...

Now do you want us to look at how God responded by:

1A. Providing manna and quail?

1B. Bring water forward from the rock?

1A. Providing manner and quail?

Exodus 16:1 The whole Israelite community set out from Elim and came to the Desert of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after they had come out of Egypt. **2** In the desert the whole community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. **3** The Israelites said to them, “If only we had died by the LORD’s hand in Egypt! There we sat around pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death.”

Can you believe how **quickly they forgot** what had just happened.

It was **only a month before**,
and now they are **whinging** and **complaining**.

Now if you are I were God...

We’d be like: to hell with this...

Go back to Egypt, see how that works out for you.

But God chooses to **look past the grumbling**...

4 Then the LORD said to Moses, “I will rain down bread from heaven for you. The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day. In this way I will test them and see whether they will follow my instructions. **5** On the sixth day they are to prepare what they bring in, and that is to be twice as much as they gather on the other days.”

I love it...

God uses this **opportunity to extend grace**,

as a **mechanism** for seeing if the **people trust** him.

To see if they are **willing to be obedient**.

I think that’s the **same premise God extends** to us today...

He **doesn’t need me to speak** to you tonight.

It’s my **privilege**,

it’s something that **God has given to me**,
and I need to treat it as such.

But it’s the same for each of us...

- Whether you’re **leading a small group**,
- Leading a **mission initiative**
- **Serving** on the door

- Speaking to someone **on God's behalf**
- Or leading at **Youthstreet** or at **Kidzife**
- Or **teaching RE.**
- **Singing** or **playing** on the platform...

That is a privilege that God offers to you.

He doesn't need you to do it...

He's God!

God's kingdom will still grow at the rate God wants it to grow,
whether I'm **dead or alive**...

In or out of serving him...

But he **offers me the opportunity** to partner with him.

Just like he offers to the Israelites the opportunity to be **fed**,
to be **looked after**,
and then to **listen**
and follow his **instruction**...

And if they can't, **God will not reward their obedience!**

And that is key...

God will reward your obedience by **providing more opportunity.**

But he doesn't have to!

He wants to,

but he wants to teach us that **obedience to him**,
is the **fastest way to experience** and **know** him.

To **taste of his love** and **presence**,

To **know of his wisdom** and **knowledge**,

And obedience **spans into every area** of your life...

Including that area that's **constantly changing**...

You know the one...

It's where this week you claim to have this set of values,
and then stuff goes down,

and you proclaim a different set of values.

I won't sleep with my girlfriend or boyfriend...

One night it gets to intense one thing leads to another.

And your value base changes...

It's actually ok to do that, God is cool with it!

So is your life one of obedience?

You see this was **preparation for the Israelites** to understand God's law and dwelling...

That God was to **provide a law** that was to **support, inform** and **strengthen** their obedience...

And he was to **give the Israelites** the honour and the glory, of choosing to dwell amongst them.

1B. Bring water forward from the rock?

Ex 17:1 The whole Israelite community set out from the Desert of Sin, traveling from place to place as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. 2 So they quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses replied, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you put the LORD to the test?"

Can you see yourself in that picture?

I see myself...
It's so hot,
So thirsty,
Hate feeling hot and thirsty.
And there is a lot of sand.
A lot of hot sand.
And I can't see any water...

Yep, I reckon I'd be whinging or wanting to whinge anyway...

So **Moses goes to God** with their miserable complaints...

With **my miserable** complaints,
And watch what God does...

Ex 17:5 The LORD answered Moses, "Walk on ahead of the people. Take with you some of the elders of Israel and take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. 6 I will stand there before you by the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it for the people to drink."

Now it is **essential** we see what's going on here...

This **isn't about Moses performing** a great miracle!
This is about **Yahweh, being a great** God.

The water from the rock is the **vehicle** that God uses to provide...
And although **Moses hits the rock with his staff**, the focus isn't on Moses...

The focus is that because Moses was obedient God could and did provide!

God uses this opportunity to **extend grace**,
In spite of the Israelites lack of faith.
 Grace is still given and offered,
 when **faith is lacking!**
 But it **does require Moses** to be obedient.
 Not to be **brilliant**, or **skillful** or **gifted**,
 just to be **obedient**.

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He **doesn't need me to speak** to you tonight.
 It's my **privilege**,
 it's something that **God has given to me**,
 and I need to treat it as such.

But it's the same for each of us...

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- Leading a **mission initiative**
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Including that area that's **constantly changing...**

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It's where this week you claim to have this set of values,
and then stuff goes down,
and you proclaim a different set of values.

I won't sleep with my girlfriend or boyfriend...

One night it gets to intense one thing leads to another.

And your value base changes...

It's actually ok to do that, God is cool with it!

Or I **really value my friends** and am **loyal** to them.

But then a couple of friends upset you,

and you dog them out,

and bag them out,

and stab them in the back,

And then you **go back to them** with no repentance,

as if **nothing went down** at all.

Or **honesty is a value** that is essentially important...

But there is no way I'm answering that question honestly,

and if I say that it exposes the inconsistencies in my life,

So no way, but it's ok, it's no big deal...

And these things,

whilst being **totally inconsistent,**

are **not under any circumstances** acts of obedience.

In fact they are surrendering yourself to the **patterns of this world.**

The **very patterns** that God calls us to **not conform** too!

And if you **keep doing** it..

God will **limit your influence**.

He will **stifle the opportunities** you will have.

And this behavior is the **fastest way** to **break down trust** with people who know you...

So Moses strikes the rock, and water runs from it, and we read...

Exodus 17:6 So Moses did this in the sight of the elders of Israel. **7** And he called the place Massah[**a**] and Meribah[**b**] because the Israelites quarreled and because they tested the LORD saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"

Notice the name he calls it..

He wants the **memory of this place** not to be a reminder of God's provision,
but to be a **reminder of their unfaithfulness** in spite of God's provision.

Because God is **trying to teach his people obedience**...

He is trying to **coax them toward faithfulness**...

Which becomes **even more pronounced** with the giving of the **ten commandments**,

And the **instruction** and creation of the **Tabernacle** which was to be god's dwelling place amongst the people:

2A. The Ten Commandments

- Foo fighters Rider is hilarious...
- It's an activity book, that has word finds, mazes, clues and pictures... which the promoter has to do in order to discover what the Foo fighters need.
- 52 pages, which is riddled with jokes and ridiculous asks, just to see if they will be met.

The deal with a rider is that it is **absolutely imperative that it be fulfilled** before the band will play.

So a band **assumes a sense of royalty** expecting all of these very particular needs be met.

This in a sense is what the **Ten Commandments** are...

They are God's rider...

But where as foo fighters really have no right at all to demand such things...

God almighty,
creator of the **known and unknown universe** actually does!

God's rider is...

fulfill these ten things I command and we can play together
in harmony.

If you don't, it gets mucked up.

So in Exodus 20

- **1** God spoke all these words:
2 "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.
3 "You shall have no other gods before[**a**] me.
4 "You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. **7**
"You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses his name.
- **8** "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
12 "Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you.

13 “You shall not murder.

14 “You shall not commit adultery.

15 “You shall not steal.

16 “You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

17 “You shall not covet your neighbor’s house. You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.”

There is **so much we can say** about the **ten commandments**, and could easily take **weeks on each one**.

We’ve got about **6 minutes!**

So I want to **debunk a myth** with that 6 minutes,

The myth is that the ten commandments were given to provide a standard by which we will be told off against.

And if you’re not sure about the validity of that,

Thing for a moment about your friends who aren’t Christians...

And one of the likely reasons they don’t want to be a Christian if they know anything about it, is because they **don’t want to live by a set of rules**.

Well this is where that thinking comes from.

The ten commandments are the **self-disclosure of God**.

A proclamation of who God is and how God is to be ‘practiced’ as a community of liberated slaves.

Remember a few weeks ago when I spoke about the fact that as God revealed **his name Yahweh**,

that was an act of **trust** and **intimacy** and **vulnerability** that he **shared with his** people.

That’s how this dialogue starts...

Again God reveals his **true nature**...

Hoping to **catch his people up in himself**.

Hoping to **win their hearts** and **allegiance** and **obedience** and **faithfulness**.

The ten commandments weren’t a ‘do this or else...’

They were an **invitation to practice Godliness**.

They were an invitation to **become intimate** with God.

Ex 20:18 When the people saw the thunder and lightning and heard the trumpet and saw the mountain in smoke, they trembled with fear. They stayed at a distance **19** and said to Moses, “Speak to us yourself and we will listen. But do not have God speak to us or we will die.”

20 Moses said to the people, “Do not be afraid. God has come to test you, so that the fear of God will be with you to keep you from sinning.”

You see as **God revealed an image** of himself,
the people were terrified...

And rightly so,
because God, who created the sun...
is going to be utterly terrifying...

Which is why Moses says ‘do not be afraid’...
There is **no reason** to be afraid,
as **God is disclosing** himself to you...

God is **showing you** who he really is,
God is **acting in a way** that is to **promote relationship** and
intimacy and **connection**.

It’s like what Jesus says..

John 14:15 “If you love me, you will **obey** what I command.”

An invitation to be obedient to God is an invitation to love God!

This is what God gives the Israelites in the desert,
An invitation to love.

This is what Jesus gives to us,
An invitation to love.

How are you treating that invitation?

That’s a powerful question isn’t it...

You see for the Israelites,
just as for us,
there were **times when they disobeyed**,
when they **dropped** the ball,
when they **chose not to trust** God,
When they **denied the invitation** to love...

God almighty,

God's rider is...
build my house exactly like this...
If you don't,
me living with you,
isn't going to happen.

It's a little like what Lyndal says to me concerning the vacuuming
or the grass getting cut...
Except even more intense!

Yeah, that's right!

- Exodus 26:1 "Make the tabernacle with ten curtains of finely twisted linen and blue, purple and scarlet yarn, with cherubim worked into them by a skilled craftsman. 2 All the curtains are to be the same size—twenty-eight cubits long and four cubits wide.[a] 3 Join five of the curtains together, and do the same with the other five.

4 Make loops of blue material along the edge of the end curtain in one set, and do the same with the end curtain in the other set. 5 Make fifty loops on one curtain and fifty loops on the end curtain of the other set, with the loops opposite each other. 6 Then make fifty gold clasps and use them to fasten the curtains together so that the tabernacle is a unit.

And what **follows this appetiser** are another **179 verses** describing exactly how the Tabernacle and everything in it was to be made and what it was to look like!

CRAZY right!

So how do we make sense of this?

Well let me tell you what a Tabernacle actually is...

The Tabernacle was the **portable dwelling place** for the **divine presence**.

It was understood to **literally be God's house**...

The place in which **God dwelt**.

The Tabernacle describes an inner shrine (named **Holy of Holies**) housing the Ark,

if you want to know more about the Arc of the Covenant, just watch Indiana Jones!

There was also the outer chamber (Holy Place), with a golden lampstand, table for showbread, and altar of incense.

So we have **pages upon pages of Scripture** that speak to the intricate detail of every aspect of the design of this dwelling place.

Why is that?

Well for a **dwelling place to be fit** for the **Lord of Lord's** and the **king of kings**,

It had to be **perfect!**

It had to be **superb** and **magnificent** in every way.

And so the instruction is **meticulous and painstakingly accurate**...

Because it was understood that **every aspect of the tabernacle**,
 if God was **to dwell there**,
 needed to **glorify God**,
 as per God's **instruction**.

The Tabernacle is a symbol of God's presence.
 It is the **representation of his nature**...

The other day I scored major points.
 We'd had a gathering at our place on the weekend, and things had
 been crazy busy,
 So there was some mess left over, that just needed a vacuuming
 and a sweep and fix up...

I was writing this sermon and needed a break, so I decided
 to whip around and fix it all up...

Huge points!

Here's what was going through my head...
 "I know how Lyndal wants this place to look,
 I know what she likes where,
 I know the bits she'll look to first.
 ...She does take a lot of pride in what the house looks like doesn't
 she.

Why is that?

I guess when people come around and they look at our place,
 Lyndal wants to portray to people what we are really like..."

And then I'm thinking...

so the housework was good sermon prep too...

but that's not a weekly ritual I'm willing to develop!

God wanted the Tabernacle, his dwelling place to show the world
 what he was like.

What's interesting is how Paul reflects on this idea:

1 Cor 6: **19** Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; **20** you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body.

He was speaking to a Church that were doing an excellent job at
conforming to the world...

And so what Paul was saying,

Drawing on the Jews past of what the **Tabernacle**, the **temple**, the **dwelling place of God** meant to them...

He says...

The way you live your life is the same.

The things you do and don't do,

The way you **practice and display** your sexuality,

The way you **handle and approach** alcohol,

The **understanding and desire** you have to gamble,

The way you **spend your down time**,

The stuff you **search for on the internet**,

The manner you **think about and hence engage** with the

Scriptures...

All of these things and **so many more need to be aligned** with the **idea behind** the Tabernacles instruction.

**You are not your own; 20 you were bought at a price.
Therefore honor God with your body.**

If you **acknowledge Jesus as your Lord** and savior,

Then your life is not your life anymore!

It belongs to God, so use it in way that honours God...

Because when you **don't honour** God...

When you let your **sights drift from God**

When God **gets lessoned so he is in competition** with other idols...

Bad stuff goes down...

So did you want hear about

3A. One such time involved a Golden Calf.

Listen to how this part of the story unfolds...

Ex32:1 When the people saw that Moses was so long in coming down from the mountain, they gathered around Aaron and said, "Come, make us gods[a] who will go before us. As for this fellow Moses who brought us up out of Egypt, we don't know what has happened to him."

You know the key words here...

"so long!"

Moses was up Mount Sinai,

with **God being given the laws** for the Israelites.

The **detailed instructions** of what **should happen** and how it should happen.

And if you've read **Deuteronomy** and **Leviticus**,

You'll realize that **would have taken a little while**.

So we find the Israelites complaining...

He's taking so long!

I swear I had ADD when I was a kid,

And not Adults Don't discipline, because my mum and dad were really good at it, they had lots of opportunities to practice.

But one day when I was six years old I was waiting for dinner to come out and it was taking so long, that by the time Mum appeared with the plates,

engraved on the table before me was the word Ralph

And mum went berserk...

And asked me why I did it.

And my **answer was brilliant!**

I said "I didn't do it, a fox came in and did it!"

Use that... very effective!

Besides, it wasn't my fault...

Mum took so long....

So I know how the Israelites felt...

But just like **I cannot blame Mum** for my sin...

The **Israelites cannot blame** Moses...

They did though

and as a result they **strayed**...

They **turned to Aaron for guidance** and Aaron,
 who should have known way better,
 told them to **bring all their pieces** of gold in...

- Ex 32: 4a He took what they handed him and made it into an idol cast in the shape of a calf, fashioning it with a tool.

Now there is some **conjecture on why a calf...**

The calf was actually a **Canannite God**,
 Who was known as a **god of fertility...**
 Implying that the Israelites were **claiming the security of their existence upon themselves.**

They **didn't need Yahweh** for their continuing survival.

There could also be parallels we could draw to Egyptian gods,
 that we spoke about a few weeks ago...

But regardless of where we land the point is captured in what they then say...

- Ex 32: 4b Then they said, "These are your gods, [b] O Israel, who brought you up out of Egypt."

Do you see what happens...

They completely replace Yahweh!

NOW the golden calf god is the one who was **responsible** for their freedom...

And the rest of the story is God opening up a can of... well you know...

You should be feeling right now a sense of unbelievableness...

How could Israel **so quickly forget Yahweh** to the point that they attribute their freedom to a false God.

So unbelievable that it's all too familiar don't you think...

And the problem is

we should be **waiting at the foot** of the mountain for the **next revelation** of God,
 Instead of **growing bored** and **creating our own idols.**

The Israelites show us that **boredom**
 with **no focus**
 cause us to replace **Yahweh's kingship** in our lives.

They were eager for action...

They even asked Aaron if he could make a statue,
 and then they used their own gold to do it...

It wasn't a **cost problem** or a **creative lapse...**

It was the fact that they were **bored**.

You ready for this...

Don't get bored waiting for God.

If you've been **sitting around waiting for God** to tell you what to
 do before you do anything,

you're headed for trouble.

Jesus call us to follow.

Come follow me he says.

And following is an **action**, it involves **movement** and **direction**
 and **focus**...

Now maybe you're waiting on God for the **big picture direction**,
 that's really cool,

but **do something for God** in the **small** picture.

Don't get stagnant,

Because you will be distracted by bright shiny things!

Which brings us to our final choice for the night...

Do you:

- **4A. Want the final challenge**
- 4B. Want us to go home?**

I love this one because we see God finally snap...

Numbers 21:4-9

4 They traveled from Mount Hor along the route to the Red Sea, [a] to go around Edom. But the people grew impatient on the way; 5 they spoke against God and against Moses, and said, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the desert? There is no bread! There is no water! And we detest this miserable food!"

You can sense God...

Seriously again you're whinging.

You still don't trust me.

You're really thinking being slave driven is better than this?

I've fed you, I've sheltered you, I've watered you, I've guided you,

I've loved you, and the best you have is ungratefulness...

Then I can imagine god turning to the other members of the trinity...

Snakes?

Send in the snakes?

If it's death you want, it is death you shall get...

Num 21:6 Then the LORD sent venomous snakes among them; they bit the people and many Israelites died.

They relinquished the fear of the Lord,

They had not trusted God,

and it was trust that made it safe to fear God!

They feared God because he could destroy them,

but they trusted that he wouldn't.

Here they loose all trust in God,

so much so that they don't approach him with any

fear,

Just arrogance and entitlement

And so God throws something at them that they will fear,

but cannot trust,

In order that they will turn their trust to him again.

And it works...

Num 21:7 The people came to Moses and said, “We sinned when we spoke against the LORD and against you. Pray that the LORD will take the snakes away from us.” So Moses prayed for the people.

8 The LORD said to Moses, “Make a snake and put it up on a pole; anyone who is bitten can look at it and live.” **9** So Moses made a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the bronze snake, he lived.

Does anyone recognize this photo?

This is where it originates from...

This is a **medical bracelet** and people with a number of different medical conditions wear them,

Trusting that if something goes wrong,

and they are unable to **communicate**,
that someone will see their bracelet and go and get help and they will be saved!

It comes from this **display of grace** that God offers the Israelites.

They **didn't deserve** to live,

They actually **wanted to die**, to go back to Egypt,

They approached God with such **distain** and **dismissal**...

Yet God's response was still of **compassion**, of **love**, of **kindness**, of **grace**.

Which ultimately **re-instated the Israelites trust** in him.

That is what the **cross is for us**...

It is a **display of God's grace**,

that is meant to **renew our trust in God**.

So that when we look at the cross,

we see that which we have been saved from...

The **cross** like the **snake**,

Divert our attention from **being ok with our sin**,

To that which Christ offered us in order to deal with our sin.

So that within us would be created an **insatiable desire for the things of God**.

So we might **realize** that it is **worth trusting in God** with our life,
because of **what we can be saved** from!

Which brings us to your final choice of the night....

4A. Want the final challenge

We've walked through 40 years of desert tonight.

And there is **so much we haven't covered**,

Both that I prepared and more that I haven't.

in case you're feeling a bit ripped off that we didn't touch on something you were keen to.

We've looked at:

Mana and Quail –

Water From the Rock –

10 commandments –

Tabernacle –

And all of these stories, and instances, and challenges from Scripture,

all point to **one eternal question**...

What will you do and what are you doing with Jesus Christ?

Does he have you?

Does he have your obedience?

Does he have your trust?

Does he have your loyalty?

And you'll know by the way you live out your life!

In August 1957 four climbers—two Italians and two Germans—were climbing the 6,000 foot near-vertical North Face in the Swiss Alps. The two German climbers disappeared and were never heard from again. The two Italian climbers, exhausted and dying, were stuck on two narrow ledges a thousand feet below the summit.

The Swiss Alpine Club forbade rescue attempts in this area (it was just too dangerous), but a small group of Swiss climbers decided to launch a private rescue effort to save the Italians.

So they carefully lowered a climber named Alfred Hellepart down the 6,000 foot North Face. They suspended Hellepart on a cable a fraction of an inch thick as they lowered him into the abyss.

Here's how Hellepart described the rescue in his own words:

As I was lowered down the summit ... my comrades on top grew further and further distant, until they disappeared from sight. At this moment I felt an indescribable aloneness. Then for the first time I peered down the abyss of the North Face of the Eiger. The terror of the sight robbed me of breath. ...The brooding blackness of the Face, falling away in almost endless expanse beneath me, made me look with awful longing to the thin cable disappearing about me in the mist. I was a tiny human being dangling in space between heaven and hell. The sole relief from terror was ...my mission to save the climber below.

That is the **heart of the Gospel** story.

That is the **heart of the Exodus** story...

We were trapped,

but in the **person and presence of Jesus**,

God **lowered himself** into the abyss of our sin and suffering.

In Jesus God became "a tiny human being dangling between heaven and hell."

He did it to save the people trapped below—you and me.

Thus, the gospel,

whether in the pages of the Old or the New Testament

tell us the story of God's risky,

costly, sacrificial rescue effort on our behalf.

That demands our **best**,
our **trust**,
our **hearts**,
our **obedience**
and our **lives**...

A theme we see **again and again in the desert** in Israel,
